MISSION STATEMENT in 3 parts.

Short Version:

- The promotion to the public of the *astounding beauty* of the natural environment of Death Valley National Park.
- The promotion to the public of the importance of *desert conservation*.
- The promotion to the public for financial support in continuing “*thy* Death Valley House”™ (proposed for 210 West Main Street in Beatty, Nevada, USA) as a *legacy location* after resident landscape photographer, Martin J. Blahnik, dies, so that new artists of Death Valley can have a place to display their work.

Long Version:

- Forevermore from the eons of time one sees in the grand vistas of Death Valley National Park the handiwork of God in giving us Mother Nature’s stupendous beauty. Our wish is to have this enthralling place, this national treasure, placed upon a pedestal. To aid in bringing this wish to fruition, there is the landscape photography at “*thy* Death Valley House”™ in Beatty, Nevada, USA, where the public will register their final judgments.
- With changing demographics where populations are increasing over time, visitation to National Parks and other wilderness areas in the USA will continue to rise, causing expected increased visitor impact on natural environments. The promotion to the public of the astounding beauty of Death Valley as displayed at “*thy* Death Valley House”™ will serve a political role, insofar as supporting measures for environmental protection, specifically desert conservation and maintenance of Death Valley National Park.
- To have business success with Death Valley Landscapes, LLC, is one thing; but to create the circumstances for “*thy* Death Valley House”™ to live on after the death of founder and resident photographer, Martin J. Blahnik, the “Desert Doc,” is quite another. This legacy objective would entail opportunities for artists of Death Valley National Park to display their work at “*thy* Death Valley House”™, via precise, legally-defined rules that will require Beatty and Nye County officials to manage the property, and continue identifying a variety of financial avenues to keep the business solvent, after the building is moved into the public domain upon the death of Dr. Blahnik.
